



PROTOCOL FOR CHILDREN WITH ASTHMA AND ALLERGIES

- All parents who have indicated on a register for an after-school club or holiday camp will be contacted by the office * and a request made for an asthma pump or autoinjector, clearly labelled to be handed to the coach at the start of the class or camp session, along with a care plan and signed permission for administering medication.
- All pumps and autoinjectors are to be returned to the child at the end of the class or camp session.
- Coaches are to highlight all children with allergies and/or asthma on the register before the class.
- A guideline sheet on how to deal with an asthma attack will be available in the camp/after-school folder.

* “You have indicated, when registering your child for a recent after-school class or holiday camp session, a medical condition which requires the use of an autoinjector and/asthma pump.

As part of Munchkin Sports’ protocol, to ensure the safety and well-being of the children in our care, please could you provide a clearly labelled autoinjector and/or asthma pump for your child to hand to the coach at the start of each class and/or holiday camp session.

Our Head coaches are Paediatric First Aid trained and have been trained in the administration of autoinjector and asthma pumps and will return the items to the child at the end of each class/session.
